#### **Events/April Happenings:**

April 4<sup>th</sup> Day of Action: Each year on the First Tuesday in April is Sexual Assault Awareness Month (SAAM) Day of Action. We focus awareness upon sexual violence prevention by wearing teal.

April 21st Vinyasa Against Violence Yoga Event: This is Safe Haven's 5th Annual Vinyasa Against Violence. We are excited to be back at Stubborn Brothers Brewery this year for this empowering Evening! Also happening is Shawano Downtown Ladies' Day. The theme is "Ladies Supporting Ladies" During this event, Shawano Downtown is teaming up with Safe Haven in support of Sexual Assault Awareness month. You'll find many of our Shawano Downtown stores offering specials that support Safe Haven. Wear teal on Ladies' Day in support of Sexual Assault Awareness month! Shawano Downtown will be surprising shoppers, who are wearing teal, with Shawano Downtown shopping dollars.

April 26<sup>th</sup> Denim Day: Show support for sexual assault by wearing denim jeans. Denim Day is a campaign that began after a ruling by the Italian Supreme Court where a rape conviction was overturned because the justices felt that since the victim was wearing tight jeans, she must have helped the person who raped her remove her jeans, thereby implying consent. The following day, the women in the Italian Parliament came to work wearing jeans in solidarity with the victim. Peace Over Violence developed the Denim Day campaign in response to this case and the activism surrounding it. Since then, what started as a local campaign to bring awareness to victim blaming and

destructive myths that surround sexual violence has grown into a movement. As the longest running sexual violence prevention and education campaign in history, Denim Day asks community mem-



bers, elected officials, businesses and students to make a social statement with their fashion statement by wearing jeans on this day as a visible means of protest against the misconceptions that surround sexual violence.

#### **Child Abuse Prevention and Family Strengthening Month Awareness**

## Safe Haven Statistics (January-December 2022)

- Shelter provided safe housing: 68 adults and 72 children
- Shelter received 2574 crisis calls
- Provided support group to 38 women and 13 children
- Provided 4220 services to 398 victims (women, men, and children)
- Law enforcement completed 114 intimate partner lethality assessments during a domestic violence call. 55% of the calls screened in as high danger/potential homicide risk
- Law enforcement averaged 10 intimate partner domestic violence calls per month
- Safe Haven Team presented to 34 groups at area schools, grades K-12, educating 842 children
- Safe Haven Team gave 10 presentations to various community groups, educating 560 people
- Safe Haven Team provided 52 community awareness activities
- Safe Haven Team provided 5 professional trainings to area business or agencies
